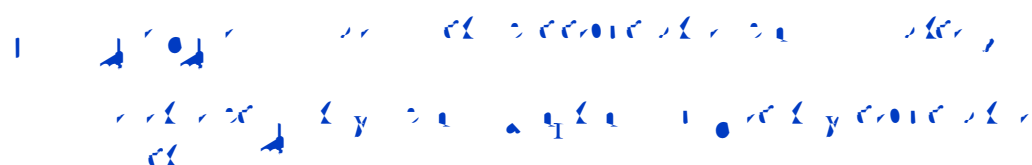

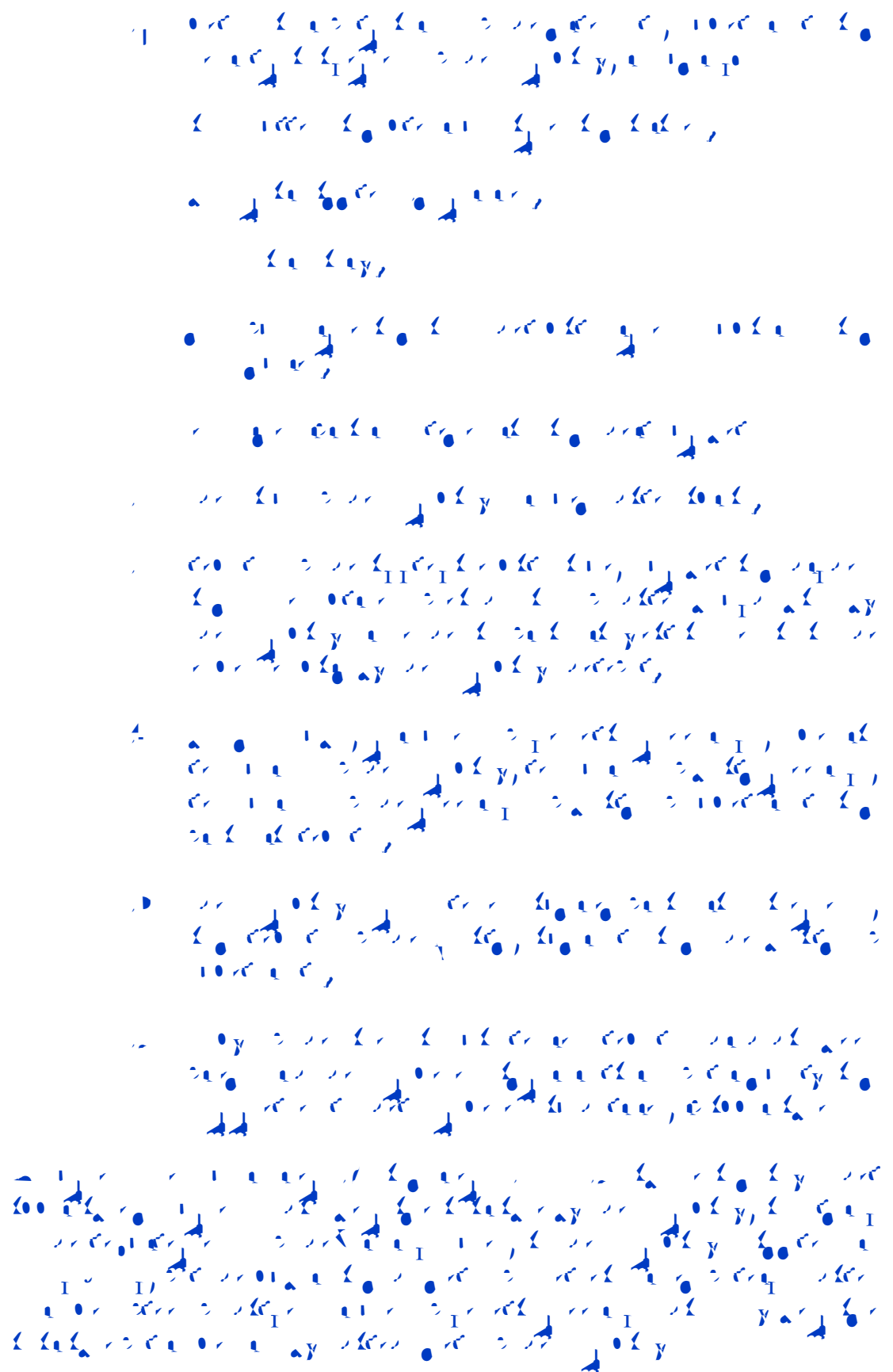

Article 69

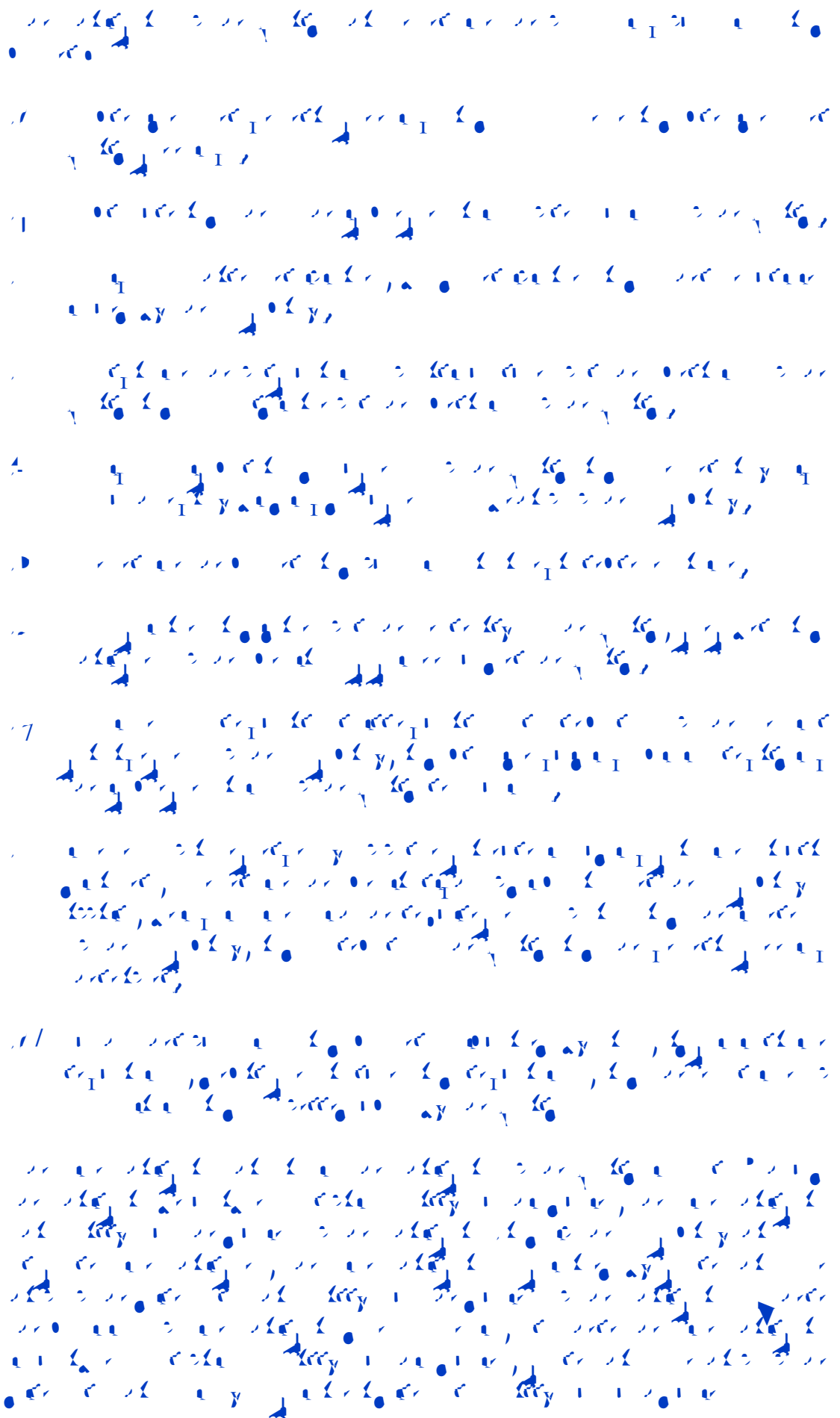
